What We Do

With limited time and resources it's a huge challenge for educators to understand and support every student's aspirations and aptitude.

We've dedicated ourselves to bridging this gap.

Working closely with our partner districts and schools, we:

- → Survey students to generate 43 unique insights on how schools can offer opportunities to excel.
- → Increase the number of advanced courses like AP and IB, and enroll students who are capable but were overlooked.
- Help schools improve personalized support so students have access to every opportunity.

Our Approach

In suburban, urban and rural communities alike, our Action for Equity process proves that when districts invest in understanding students, it sets them on a path to success in the classroom and beyond. Without that understanding:

→ 750,000 underrepresented and underserved students miss out on the chance to take challenging classes each year. **First-time schools start in Phase 1** and advance as they meet predetermined milestones.

PHASE 1

Access Opportunity

- → Facilitated site visits and coaching
- → Analyze equity barriers and opportunities
- → Identify students for outreach and enrollment
- → Develop student and staff support plan

PHASE 2

Experience Success

- → Facilitated staff workshops
- → Focus on student belonging, experience and growth mindset
- → Provide student listening sessions
- → Present grade and success analysis
- → Continued access to AO tools

Following Phase 2, EOS works with schools to extend and sustain their equity work while addressing opportunity gaps.


Glenbard School District

Before Glenbard School District began its partnership with EOS, 34% of their 11th and 12th-grade underrepresented and underserved students took AP classes.

→ After their partnership with EOS, that percentage had risen to 51%.
